Stinging is one thing, but individuals who are allergic to them must be very aware as these stings could turn into anaphylaxis. To counteract these types of reactions, most people carry an Epi-pen. However, the Club has Epi-pens available in the following locations:

> 1.Gas Dock 2.Front Desk 3.East Beach

This for both adults and children. There is a needle attached and all you have to do is inject it usually in the thigh. In addition to that, you should call 911 and/or seek medical attention immediately.

The Epi-pens are available for your safety, so please take care of them.

2020 FALL SAILING AND NEW PROGRAMMING REPORT

Our fall sailing options are a first for us this year, with private lessons, open sailing sessions, after school group lessons and race team practices. We are still running programming almost daily, although at a slower pace than camp time. We follow strict sanitation guidelines for both our hands and our boats, and we have an on-land mask policy (not on water while sailing).

2020 PROGRAM USAGE AND ADDITIONAL REVENUE

We launched private sailing lessons in June, Open sailing in July, and Fall Race Team/Opti and FJ Group lessons in August. At last count, we hosted 82 total individual sailors for private lessons with multiple lessons taken by each sailor. Some lessons were a "2 for 1" (friends, siblings or parent/child matchups), while only 22% were current members. A special shout out to the McCarthy's, Vigils and Steffees - they are all new member families and are taking full advantage of our options! This should provide the Club with a strong 2021 membership push.


