



Hypothermia Tips April 2021

Welcome to another boating season: I first would like to welcome all our new boating members. Boating is a lot of fun and our power and sailing fleet certainly have events organized for this year. Be sure to check to contact who is organizing them this year. Also, just ask your next store neighbor!! You will meet a lot of new friends here. However, we also take Safety and Rules at MHYC seriously. I will be publishing an article each month on different aspects of safety.

There has been a lot of activity this past weekend getting everything prepared. The channel dredging is complete and I am sure you are aware the water is still relatively high. Even though it is warmer inland, it is much chillier by the lake due to the temperature of the water. Keep in mind the temperature of the water is 38 degrees. There are 3 or 4 boats in the water now so I think it is appropriate to address hypothermia.

There are a few reminder points: First, if you are unfortunate enough to fall in the water, any water temperature below 50 degrees for any more than 60 minutes or so is not compatible with life! Until help arrives, there are a few things you can do to increase the chances of survival:

#1 DO NOT LEAVE THE BOAT AND ATTEMPT TO SWIM TO SHORE UNLESS THE SHORELINE IS A FEW FEET AWAY. The body cools down 35x as fast and children will cool down even faster. For example, a good swimmer at best can swim only 8/10 of a mile before becoming overcome with hypothermia.

- #2 Assuming a fetal position helps to reduce heat loss.
- #3 Keep your head out of the water as it also reduces heat loss
- #4 Always have a flotation device available and if more than one person, huddle together. Survival time with flotation device and light clothing increase survival time.
- #5 If you rescue someone in this type of water rapid rewarming is essential. Remove heavy clothing and wrap them with any dry clothing (towels, blankets, etc.) you can find. Then call 911 immediately.

Be safe out there! Watch for the dates for the CPR classes this year!

As you probably know, "The Courts" are getting a make-over.

The paving and improved water drainage part of the project was completed in the fall of 2020. We have now contracted for the second phase this spring 2021 with the acrylic surfacing, painting and lining.

Our vision has been to rejuvenate the old court area so that MHYC can offer even more healthy, active lifestyle choices. Seeing the enthusiasm around the makeshift pickleball courts last year got the ball rolling (literally!). See photos. When the final phase is complete this spring, we will have a safer refurbished multi-use surface which will include pickleball, tennis, basketball and 4-square.

5.Differentiating us from all other yachting clubs on Lake Erie.
6.Providing motivation for the club to rebuild "The Courts" clubhouse (wink wink).




