Additionally, new Dock Contracts and Proof of Insurance for all boaters is mandatory prior to launch. It's best to keep your paperwork up to date as it protects both you and the Club.

Keep a steady eye out for the MHYC calendar of events which is growing. A trivia night is upcoming in February along with a boating safety seminar in March. The Cruising Fleet has organized additional events and as a reminder, anyone may join the Fleet including boaters and non-boaters alike. Skeet is in full swing with practice and shooting events scheduled through the end of March. Pickleballers are occasionally meeting offsite to keep in shape and will have a full season of events planned for 2023. Again, Pickleball is open to all members. 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The House Committee was able finalize a number of ongoing projects during the month of January. I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge and thank Cecilia Duer for all her hard work and leadership over the past year, which truly facilitated the completion of these projects. Thank you Cecilia!

- A section of the kitchen floor has been replaced and retiled which alleviates a safety concern. In addition a new dishwasher has been installed which will ensure all plates and flatware are cleaned and returned to service as quickly as possible.
- New Chaise lounges and umbrellas for the pool are on order and are expected to arrive well in advance of the pool opening. Lounges will have a white frame and a navy blue, fine mesh sling material. We are looking forward to putting them out on the pool deck!
- We have a new pool deck canopy on order and will have it up in time for Memorial Day. Our vendor will also be repairing some of the damaged components on the frame prior to putting the canopy up.
- A fresh coat of paint is being applied to the walls in our entrance way and down the hall that leads to the dining and fireplace room.
   We are covering the salmon color with an off-white color. It brightens things up nicely
- The roof has become a concern and the House Committee is in the process of addressing it. We will be using tiles made with composite technology. These tiles will stand up better to the high winds and inclement weather that Lake Erie throws at our clubhouse over the course of any given year. Given the magnitude of this project, we will be completing it in phases. The first phase, to be complete this spring will include the pitched roof over the fireplace room and may also include replacement of the flat roof over the bar. Timing is a factor in this decision, as we want this project to be completed before we enter the summer season.

- Spectrum has been out to replace some
  of the cables that connect to our TV's. The
  result is more reliable reception and a
  better picture. We will also be working on
  the Sonos music system shortly so we
  have music available for the lounge and
  dining areas.
- We have updated a few of our PC's that are used by our staff. Doing so has opened the door to updating our Jonas software. For those who are not aware, Jonas is the software we use for our club operations. From accounting to dinner reservations, Jonas keeps the club running. And once Jonas is updated, we will have the chance to consider a number of new capabilities from analyzing member dining preferences to better ways our staff can take your order.
- In the previous bullet item, I mention reservations. Please make dinner reservations. Our management team puts great effort into right-sizing the number of dining staff we have on hand in a given evening. If we have a large influx of unexpected members without reservations, our staff becomes overwhelmed and the likely result is a poor dining experience. Needless to say, this is something we all want to avoid. Of course there will be times when you want to drop in at the last minute and by all means our members are always welcome.
