

CLEAN MARINA

Clean Marina Update:

MHYC is a Platinum Level Clean Marina, an important and very distinguished title in Ohio.

This year for the first time we were able to participate, thanks to our members, staff and contractors, in a recycling program for shrink wrap.

'Since 2006, boaters, marinas and greenhouses participating in the Ohio Clean Marinas Program shrink wrap recycling program have diverted more than 2.3 million pounds of waste from landfills. The low-density polyethylene has been recycled into guard rail blocks along nearly 430 miles of Ohio highways'.



"Ohio is one of longest running shrink wrap recycling programs in the Great Lakes, said Sarah Orlando, Ohio Clean Marinas program manager. This year the program gets a boost from a new partnership with Firelands Local, a nonprofit business in Norwalk, Ohio. The business will pick up the shrink wrap from marinas and bale it for Mondo Polymer Technologies, the company that recycles the plastic'. Even better

"At Firelands Local, our mission is to find and provided meaningful work for adults with developmental disabilities," said James Johnson, executive officer. "Boat wrap recycling is a win on multiple fronts. We are helping keep tons of plastic out of our dumps every year, and it helps us provide quality work for our employees."

Sarah explains that unlike discarded paper, wood and food, the plastic never breaks down completely. "We know plastic only breaks down in smaller and smaller pieces," she said. "It's one of the most perpetual types of waste in our environment. The shrink wrap recycling program is a partnership of the Ohio Clean Marinas Program, NOAA, Ohio Department of Natural Resources Ohio Coastal Management Program and Ohio Sea Grant.

MHYC will continue the pilot program with our 'Sea Bin' gathering plastic from the water and recycled. We are hoping for greater success this summer, getting the bin in prior to duck weed and leaf falling season.

And finally, we are awaiting the final paperwork for the grant which will provide us with the new pump out station, lift station and ADA dock replacing the older steel dock north east of the gas dock. Have a safe and clutter free summer!

Welcome to another boating season!

I first would like to welcome all our new boating members. Boating is a lot of fun, and our power and sailing fleets certainly have events organized for this year. Be sure to contact and register with who is organizing them this year. Also, just ask your next store neighbor!! You will meet a lot of new friends here.

However, we also take Safety and Rules at MHYC seriously. I will be publishing an article each month on different aspects of safety. On April 1, 2023, MHYC hosted a Safety in the Harbor 2 hr., very informative session on Safety in the Harbor. We are grateful too the USCG Station Fairport Harbor for joining us and relaying the new safety information. I will post most of this information and leave copies at the Front Desk so you can have a copy for your boats.

There was a lot of activity this past weekend getting everything prepared. The channel dredging is almost completed as I write this article. Even though it is warmer inland, it much chillier by the lake due to the temperature of the lake being 40+ degrees. We have a few boats in the water, so I think it is appropriate to address Hypothermia; i.e. Cold water immersion prevention and Rescue, Recover and Re-warm.

A few reminder points:

- 1. Dress in layers for the temperature of the water.
- 2. Remember the 1-10 Rule: Rule You may need one minute to control your breathing, if immersed in cold water. Slow down your breathing, so you can think clearly. Depending on the temperature (now), you may have 10 minutes for self-rescue before losing your ability to use your arms and legs, then 60 minutes until hypothermia sets in.

#1 <u>DO NOT ATTEMPT LEAVE THE BOAT AND ATTEMPT TO SWIM TO SHORE UNLESS THE SHORELINE IS A FEW FEET.</u> The body cools down 35x as fast and children will cool down even faster. For example, a good swimmer at best can swim only 8/10 of a mile before becoming overcome with hypothermia.

#1 If there is more than one person huddle together and:

#2 Assuming a fetal position helps to reduce heat loss.

#3 Keeping ones head out of the water will also help reduce the heat loss.

#4 Always have a flotation device available and if there is more than one person, huddle together. Survival time with this device, which should absolutely needs to be Coast Guard approved, increases the chances of survival.

#5 If you rescue someone in this type of water, rapid rewarming is essential. Removing heavy clothing, towels, blankets and whatever else you have available. Obviously, call 911 immediately.

PICKLEBALL CONT.....

A couple rule changes in 2023 that apply to our rec play:

If the ball hits the net on the serve, and still lands in the correct service box, it is a replay (let). If it hits the net, and lands short or out of bounds, there is no replay.

Prior to 2023, a violation of the service motion (for instance, contacting the pickleball above your waist) would result in a fault and loss of your serve. Starting in 2023, any such violation may now result in a replay (let).

If the server (or referee) calls the wrong score, any player may stop play at any time before the return of serve to correct the score. However, if any player stops play after the return of serve (or if any player stops play and the score was correct), then that player would have committed a fault.

One more rule for "The Courts" ... No gum. Too hard to get off!


